September 2017

Summer is over, kids are back to school and the Union Church is starting a new church year. We have a few changes this year – we are starting a Sunday School on September 10<sup>th</sup> and we are starting our journey into the Narrative Lectionary.

Our Sunday School will be from 10:00am to 11am, which is the same time as our worship service every Sunday morning. Parents, you are welcome to bring your children and stay for the worship service. Our intent is to have the Sunday School use the same Bible passages as the worship service so there can be some conversation, perhaps, at home between parents and their children.

Our readings this year are setup using the Narrative Lectionary (NL). The Revised Common Lectionary (RCL) is used by most Christian churches each Sunday. There are a few differences between the two lectionaries.

The NL has a four-year cycle and the RCL has a three-year cycle. The four-year cycle covers more stories from the Bible and each year one of the four Gospels is highlighted, giving greater attention to each gospel. "On the Sundays from September through May each year the texts follow the sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian church. The texts show the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture. They invite people to hear the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the prophets, Jesus, and Paul. Listening to the many different voices within Scripture enriches preaching and the life of faith." (www.workingpreacher.org)

I am beyond excited to be working at the Union Church of Proctor. For August, I have been playing piano and organ while we are in search for an accompanist. The welcome at the beginning of August was incredible, and I am truly blessed to have landed here at the Union Church of Proctor.

#### Short Biography of Eddie:

Conductor, pianist, and singer Eddie Wilkin encourages all to find their artistic voice through music. He comes to this philosophy from past experiences at home, in school, and through his recent musical activities.

Eddie studied Music Education at Castleton University (formerly Castleton State College), located in Castleton, Vermont. As a result of the opportunities he had with the ensembles under the supervision of Sherrill Blodget and Glenn Giles, he realized that he wanted to pursue conducting. After graduating with a Bachelors degree of Music in Music Education, he went on to pursue a Masters degree in Choral and Orchestral Conducting from the University of Rhode Island where he studied with Mark Conley, Ann Danis, Gene Pollart and Brian Cardany. Currently, he is finishing up at Castleton University for a second Masters in Music Education with a focus on The Community Choral experience and warm-ups designed for the aging singer. He has also accepted admission to the Doctorate of Education program at the University of New England to study Transformational Leadership.

During his undergraduate and graduate career Eddie has been an active conductor of large choral and instrumental groups such as Concert Choirs, Chamber Ensembles, Symphony Orchestras, Wind Ensembles, as well as Chamber Strings. Currently, he is the Director of Choral Activities at Fair Haven Union High School, located in Fair Haven, Vermont. He is also the Artistic Director and founder of The Slate Valley Singers, and the Conductor for the Rutland City Band. He has conducted Lakes Region Youth Orchestra, and at Grace Church in Rutland, Vermont.

Residing in Poultney, Vermont, originally from Cresskill, New Jersey, he finds time to enjoy the beauty of nature and what life has to offer. As a side hobby, he enjoys woodworking and traveling. The Red Cross must collect nearly 14,000 blood donations every day for patients at approximately 2,600 hospitals across the country."

Now that Fall is rolling around, it's easy to do your part. **To schedule an appointment** for our blood drive, **go online to** <u>redcrossblood.org</u> and click "Find a Drive," **or call 1-800-RED-CROSS** (<u>1-800-733-2767</u>) and follow the prompts. To date, we have made and donated over 100 quilts.




