
* 200 volunteers are needed to assemble meals for this program on Saturday, January 19, 2019. We hope members of our church community will consider volunteering on that day.

LADIES LUNCH




Our September Ladies' Lunch will take place at the Rutland Country Club at 11:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 11th. Come and join us!
