OUTREACH

The Outreach Committee, representing the members of the Union Church of Proctor, are off to a good start in 2022.

The checks that were sent out for the first quarter totaled \$3000. The Pittsford Food Shelf, serving Pittsford, Proctor, Florence and Chittenden, received \$1500 over three months. VNA and Hospice of the Southwest Region received \$500 as did BROCC. The final check for this quarter, in the amount of \$500, went to the Ukrainian refugees through the International Rescue Committee. The Outreach Committee has a working budget this year of \$12,486. Thank you to all our members! The U.C.P. is once again collecting food, personal care items and paper products to help fill the shelves at the Pittsford Food Shelf. The non-perishable items are collected each week at the Sunday Service. Please come and help fill a bag! Comments and suggestions for the committee are welcomed and may go through the church office.

THE WORK OF THE PASTORAL SEARCH COMMITTEE IS UNDERWAY!



To date, in March we conducted a congregational survey and updated the church profile. The survey is important as it provides the committee information of the congregation's needs, concerns, and hopes as we seek a new minister.

The church profile gives prospective candidates for the position a picture of who we are, who we are seeking in a minister, and what's important to us as a congregation. Both are essential components of moving forward in the search process.

Next steps include approval of the church profile by the Church Council and then advertising the position. Jeff and Kay Bergquist have graciously stepped up to act as our co-chairs and as such will be receiving and corresponding with applicants and disseminating applications to the committee. Our committee will make reports to the Church Council and share with the congregation periodically as we make progress to keep you apprised of our work. Please keep the Pastoral Search Committee and our congregation in your prayers that we might be led by the Holy Spirit and be faithful witnesses to God's mission in this next chapter of UCP's history.

Of interest to the committee upon updating the church profile was to note that in the past 2-3 years we have seen significant changes within the town of Proctor, which may have bearing on the church's role in the community going forward. Just giving two examples, it was noted that Proctor, like many towns in Vermont, is experiencing an influx of families from all over the United States. Also noted, UCP is now the only congregation in Proctor which worships weekly. St. Paul Lutheran Church meets monthly and services at St. Dominic Catholic Church occur once every three months, with mass rotating between St. Dominic and the parishes of St. Bridget's and St. Stanislaus-Kostka in West Rutland. These and other insights provide an evolving and new understanding of who we are, who our neighbor is, and what the potential role for the church and new minister will be in this context.

Thank you for your responses to the congregational survey. We had 29 responses, which was excellent.

The summary of the congregational survey follows this article. If you have any questions or input for the Pastoral Search Committee, please feel free to be in touch with one of us and we will bring it to the group. Thank you for entrusting us with this important work!


