"[Mary Magdalene] said to [the angels at the tomb], "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher).

John 20:13b-16 (NRSV)

This passage for me is the epitome of the Easter story. Mary stands there, does not recognize Jesus who stands before her until Jesus calls her name. The calling of her name sends chills up and down my spine because Jesus calls our name all the time. Mary recognizes Jesus upon her name being called, but do we recognize Jesus when our name is called?

Perhaps Mary's eyes are filled with tears at the whole thought of Jesus dying and now his body is gone, so she cannot see Jesus through the tears. But the sound of Jesus' voice calling her name wipes away the fog and brings some clarity into Mary's eyes! How her heart must have leaped at the sound of her name!

Easter is the time of resurrection of Jesus, but in the sense of our lives, it is a time when we are resurrected from death...and death come in so many ways into our lives. But within those deaths, Jesus calls our name to walk with us through the death and into some clarity in our lives.

"Somewhere in every heart there is a discerning voice...Its intention is to keep the heart clean and clear. This voice is an inner whisper not obvious or known to others outside. Yet much depends on that small voice. The truth of its whisper marks the line between honor and egoism, kindness and chaos...That whisper brings forgotten nobility into an arena where violence

has [maligned] everything. This faithful voice can illuminate the dark lands of despair. It becomes both the sign and presence of a transcendence that no force or horror can extinguish...In haunted places this voice carries the light of beauty like a magical lantern to transform desolation, to remind us that regardless of what may be wrenched from us, there is a dignity and hope that we do not have to lose. This voice brings us directly into contact with the inalienable presence of beauty in the soul."

MANDALA STONE PAINTING WORKSHOP

What is a mandala?

A mandala is a complex abstract design that is usually circular in form. In fact, "mandala" is a Sanskrit word that means "circle". Mandalas generally have one identifiable center point, from which emanates an array of symbols, shapes and forms. Mandalas can contain both geometric and organic forms. They can also contain recognizable images that carry meaning for the person who is creating it. In essence mandalas represent the connection between our inner worlds and outer reality. Designing your own mandalas can be both inspirational and therapeutic.

Mandala Stones have become a popular craft of late – both for the ease with which one can create beautiful and colorful patterns on stones and because the process of painting mandala stones is, in itself, a pathway to meditative calm. On Saturday, April 27th, Andrea Varney will lead us in a workshop on painting Mandala stones.

The technique is surprisingly easy — we'll use a simple "dip and dot" method to make spots of color on smooth beach stones. Different sized dots are formed by dipping variously sized tools

into paint, then touching the tool to the surface of the stone to leave a spot of color. The meditation comes into play as one carefully places "dots" in concentric circles around a central starting place. Intricate patterns are created by varying the size of the dots, their colors, and their placement in relation to one another. The process is surprisingly relaxing, and as the colors spread out across the stone, the results are almost always lovely.

We will be using real beach stones collected from Wells Beach, Maine; acrylic paints; and various tools (paint brushes -- the "non-business" end, chopsticks, wooden skewers, toothpicks, paper clips, push pins, and more) all of which will be provided, although you are welcome to bring your own tools to share. Wear clothes that can get dirty, and be prepared to be creative and have fun.

Traditionally, a Mandala is ephemeral. Once completed — the Mandala is destroyed to represent that nothing in the world is permanent. All things are always in flux. Below is a link to an article in the Huffington Post that explains this concept nicely. For our purposes, we can honor the traditional intention by giving our completed stones as gifts, or not, as you prefer.

OUTREACH MONEY REACHING NEAR AND FAR



On March 7th the Outreach Committee met to prepare the Lenten mailing. You should have received our letter and an envelope for your donation. There are also additional envelopes in the Sanctuary. As mentioned in the letter, this year's Lenten donation will be sent to McAllen, Texas, where a church and city collaboration has been set up to administer care and supplies to immigrants on their way to a better life. In addition to our Lenten work, the committee also voted on sending a check to the following charities: Church World Service, World Vision, and Rutland Area Visiting Nurses and Hospice (RAVNAH). Each organization will receive \$600 to continue their important work. World Vision has helped provide clean water for 4 million people, improved sanitation for 2.8 million people, and improved hygiene for 5 million, including construction or rehabilitation of 53,830 wells and water points.
