**THE OUTREACH COMMITTEE** resumed disbursement of donations from the church community following the Annual Meeting on February 7th, 2021. The donations decided upon were based on our last year's report, as well as urgent needs.

In February, we sent out on your behalf, \$700 to the Pittsford-Proctor Food Shelf and to the VNA & Hospice of the Southwest Region. In addition, we sent out a check from the church in the amount of \$300 to Nick Monaco. There was an article about him in the Rutland Herald. Mr. Monaco was a recipient of a double lung transplant and is a resident of Rutland. He is doing well and the check from the church lets him know that all of us hope he will continue to do so.

The March donations included **BROC** Community Action, the Vermont Foodbank and The Southwest Indian Foundation. All donations were for \$700. The third donation mentioned was in response to a suggestion made by Betty and Lon Schneider. They travel to the west in the winter months and have seen the need in the native populations there. This year, of course, they were hit significantly harder. This donation, given by all of you, will address basic needs such as housing, water and food. We are grateful that Betty and Lon alerted us to such a need in our country. Finally, the Outreach Committee always welcomes suggestions or requests for donations from our church family. Please let us know how you would like us to donate your money.
