UNION CHURCH ANNUAL CAROLING OUTREACH

The 14th Annual Church Caroling outreach will be Saturday, Dec. 14th at



5:00 pm. Please meet in the lobby of Rutland Healthcare & Rehabilitation on Nichols Street, Rutland, prior to 5:00, as 5:00 will be our start time.

We will be walking the halls and serenading the residents during their dinner hour. Doesn't matter if you can carry a tune or not.... spreading Christmas cheer is the emphasis here! Afterwards, there will be a fellowship reception at the Larson residence at 13 Kendall Avenue. Following the caroling, please proceed to the Larson residence. We are literally a block away from Rutland Healthcare and Rehabilitation, so you may park your car at either location on Nichols street. The house will be the

one lit with holiday cheer at the end of Nichols Street, where it intersects with Kendall Avenue (yellow house with black shutters). Parking is also available on Kendall Avenue on the north side of the street in front of the house.

For those with mobility issues who would be unable to take part in the caroling, we invite you to participate in the holiday fellowship reception afterwards! Feel free to wait at the Larson residence for the carolers, any time after 5:00 - however, beware that Ed the Christmas Elf may ask you for help in getting the food on the table!! If you wish, those who will not participate in the caroling, may bring a food item, or food items, for the Rutland Foodshelf.

We like to have an idea of who and how many people will attend, in case of bad weather and we need to contact you, and also so we can plan for food. However, if you are able to come at the last minute, please don't hesitate! The more the merrier! There will be a sign-up sheet in church, or you may call Amy Larson at 775-3639. Thank you! - 5. The residents clear the table and do the dishes.

The residents are quiet and respectful. We hope we are helping in some way to let them know we believe in them.

With just days to go, your help is needed to make the 17th Annual Santa's Shoppers Event a success. Join in the fun and help make this year the best one yet! Volunteers are invited to lend a hand at either (or both!) of the activities listed in bold below.

Wondering what "Santa's Shoppers" is all about? Union Church volunteers "bring the store" to the nursing home so the residents can shop for their loved ones without cost or obligation. This year the event will take place at Genesis Healthcare Mountain View Center at 9 Haywood Ave. in Rutland on Friday, December 6th, from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM.

"Santa's Shoppers" volunteers will meet at Walmart on Monday, December 2nd from 7:00-8:00 PM to select gifts in the \$5 to \$10 range. Shopping teams make the selections, taking into consideration a wide variety of items for all ages. With a wide variety of gift choices, there's likely to be something of interest for the resident to give their loved ones.

On Friday, December 6th at 1:00 PM, set-up begins for the event at Mountain View. The gifts are spread out on tables to enable the residents to easily make their choices.

The event is open to the residents from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM. Our volunteer "Gift Choice Advisors" help the residents make their selections. Each gift is then wrapped and labeled by our "Gift Wrapping Elves" and returned to the resident for safekeeping.

Santa will be there, too! He chats with everyone and has his picture taken with each participating

resident. A copy of the picture is later returned to the resident to keep.

The event stops at 4:00 PM. We then **pack up & clean up** (we're usually done by 4:30). Unused Walmart items are returned for a refund, and non-Walmart items are taken to the Parish House for sorting.

Santa's Shoppers is a longstanding and wonderful outreach mission to elders in our area. Just to see the residents' happy faces as they get caught up in the excitement will warm your heart throughout the year! *Please consider helping out wherever and whenever you can*.


I Peter 4:10 – Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms.
