It is hard for me to write a Scroll article each month. I write a sermon four times a month and it seems that I run out of words to say or, perhaps, the subject matter for the Scroll article seems so far out of reach. Plus, I sometimes think that I am supposed to come up with pithy comments about life and faith and God.

I joined a gym this month to face up to the fact that I needed to exercise more. So, I will write how that gym experience is like our Christian liturgical year.

You know, one liturgical year follows another liturgical year and they all meld together -Thanksgiving, followed by Advent, by Christmas, by Lent, by Easter and by Pentecost and the beat goes on. And maybe we lose sight of what they are supposed to mean <u>individually</u>.

At the gym, I paid for a trainer to bring me through those different exercises for different parts of the body - arms, back, legs, cardio, shoulders. The trainer spoke of muscles of which I never heard of and how they are affected by exercise.

But you know something, you don't do ALL the exercises at one time. You do you shoulder exercises and then let them rest a few days to recover. In the meantime, you do some exercise for your legs, rest, etc., etc. – you get the drift. You pay attention to one part during one exercise time.

Same for the liturgical year...we take time to be in Advent in expectation and wonder at what the birth of Jesus will bring us. We rest in this time and we look at ourselves and find what is good and what needs changing because the birth of Jesus brings change.

And Christmas...go to church and be part of the recognition of the birth and what it means for each of us. At the Christmas Eve service (8:00PM on December 24th), when we form a circle, light candles and sing "Silent Night", it is all about our community (not only the church, but the Proctor community) and what Jesus means to us and what we mean to each other.

Expectation (Advent), followed by Christmas (celebration of Jesus' birth and our birth into a new year) ...exercise one part at a time, rest, exercise again.

We are literally a block away from RHRC, so you may park your car at either location on Nichols St. The house will be the one lit with holiday cheer at the end of Nichols St., where it meets Kendall Ave. Parking is also available on Kendall Ave. on the north side of the street in front of the house.

For those with mobility issues who would be unable to take part in the caroling, we invite you to participate in the holiday fellowship reception afterwards! Feel free to wait at the Larson residence for the carolers, any time after 5:00 – however, don't be surprised if Ed the Elf asks for help in getting the food on the table!

If you wish, all participants may bring a food item for the Rutland Food Shelf.

Santa's Shoppers Volunteers, "bring the store" to the nursing home, so the residents may shop for their loved ones, without cost or obligation! This year the event will take place at **Rutland Healthcare & Rehabilitation Center (RHRC) at 46 Nichols St. in Rutland** on **Friday, December 7th from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM**.

On Saturday, December 1st from 9:30-11:30 AM, volunteers will meet at the Parish house to take stock of our existing inventory for this year's event. Then we'll pack it all up for transport to the RHRC on the day of the event. Many thanks to the Men's Coffee Hour fellows who've already volunteered to haul the "stuff" upstairs, following their Saturday Coffee that morning.

"Santa's Shoppers" volunteers will meet at **Walmart on Monday, December 3rd from 7:00-8:00 PM** to select gifts in the \$5 to \$10 range. Shopping teams make the selections, taking into consideration a wide variety of items for all ages, as the gift may be for a child, elderly person, other family members or friends. Regardless of the taste or interest of the person who is to receive the gift, there is likely to be something of interest for the resident to give their loved ones.

On Wednesday, Dec. 5th from 9:00 AM to Noon, volunteers will meet at the Parish House to package and wrap candy in mugs and other containers, put together cheese packages, and the like. These items are decorated in festive holiday fare and are then packed up ready to be taken to the nursing home on Friday.

On Friday, December 7th at 1:00 PM, set-up begins for the event **at RHRC**. The gifts are spread out on tables to enable the residents to easily make their choices.

The event is open to the residents from 2:00 PM to 4:00 PM. The residents select the gift(s) that best suit the person(s) they are shopping for. (Selections are usually limited to no more than three items per resident, but we are flexible, particularly if the person has a large family, etc.). "Santa's Helpers" volunteers help the residents make their selections and wrap & tag each gift for them.

Santa will be there, too! He chats with everyone and has his picture taken with each participating resident. A copy of the picture is later returned to the resident to keep. A decorated Christmas tree and Christmas music help add to the Spirit of Christmas, spreading joy and good will to all.

The event stops at 4:00 PM. We then **pack up & clean up (usually from 4:00-4:30ish),** bring unused Walmart items back for a refund, and return non-Walmart items to the Parish House to be put away on Sunday.

Santa's Shoppers is a longstanding and wonderful outreach mission to elders in our area. *Please consider helping out wherever and whenever you can.* Just to see the residents' happy faces as they get caught up in the excitement will warm your heart throughout the year!
