### TO PRACTICE WHAT WE PREACH

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free," Luke 4:

The message resounds with joy and hope and it is filled with images of action! We would do well to stop and let the magnitude of the message sink into hear with ears that understand. For we too are called to proclaim through word and deed. The challenge is for each of us to figure out what this means in our daily life, and in our own unique way in the circumstances of our particular circumstances.

We hear this challenge near the end of our most joyous liturgical seasons - Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. Lent, a more somber time, will being on February 9. Lent is a time to slow down and prepare ourselves for the arduous calling of servanthood. On the 31st, we have an in-gathering of non-perishable food that can be distributed to those who have run out of food and can't get to the food pantry for whatever reason. We will gather the food, bless it, bag it, and store it for future use. It will be up to YOU to help spread the word of the availability of the food. .

Have an idea for an act of service for May 29? It can be an activity that takes place within the church or somewhere else, and the recipients can be anywhere in the world! This is the task to which we are called - to serve those in any kind of need.

May the rest of the Epiphany season be marked with deep revelation of God at work in the world - through you.

will take place at St Dominic's Catholic Church in Proctor. Supper is at 6:00 on Tuesday, February 9th. All are invited.




### MEN'S COFFEE

### BLOOD DRIV AT UCP




