Morning Worship Service for All Ages begins at 10:00 a.m. There will be no Luncheon or Coffee Hour.

The Annual Meeting will begin at approximately 11:15 a.m. Due to continuing COVID concerns in our area, masks and distancing will be required. The menu is as follows:


- Ham
