### **HAPPY NEW YEAR!**

“Behold, I am about to do something new;  
even now it is coming. Do you not see it?  
Indeed, I will make a way in the wilderness  
and streams in the desert.”

Isaiah 43:19

These words were written in that part of Isaiah called Second Isaiah when the Judeans were in exile in Babylonia. There is this sense from the writer that the Judeans will go back to Judah and things will be okay again.

We are not in exile unless it is self-imposed. We have the power to change things in our lives and say to ourselves “I am about to do something new.” Interestingly enough, you have the choice to determine what that ‘new’ thing will be! Choose wisely!

The New Year comes around every year (I know, I am brilliant!). It signifies a ‘new start’ among other things; a chance to start something over or to rest with what we have, but taking the time to make it better (things can always be better, can’t they?).
