The Committee is

funded by pledges to the church and by the Nelson Fund and the Sinclair Allen Fund, to whom we are very grateful. Outreach supports and funds a variety of organizations and individuals locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. Locally, we provide camp scholarships for young people in the church, the Proctor Community Concerns Council, the Fidget Quilt project, the vegetable gardens sponsored by Proctor Community Concerns, the Proctor-Pittsford Food Shelf, the Prison Ministry and Santa's Shoppers. Regionally, we offer support to Habitat for Humanity of Rutland County, the VAC Autism program, One-2-One, Dismas House, the Open Door Mission, Rutland County Women's Shelter, RAVNAH, the Rutland Meals Challenge, and the Vermont FoodBank. At the national and international levels, our contributions go to Church World Service, HEAL, Doctors Without Borders, World Vision, and the African Scholars Fund. #### June 6, 2017 Members present:

The meeting was opened with a prayer by John.

**Clerk's Report**: Motion to approve minutes (Bergquist, Lanz) Motion approved.

**Diaconate**– Ellen – Glenn's departure celebration will be Sunday 6/11. The deacons and John have been planning the celebration for the end of the service. Picnic is July 16 at Sue and Carol's. Need volunteer for photos. Vespers will be either 8/13 or 8/20. Ellen will check with Emily to see if she has a preference. Deacons talked about ways to get out into the community more. We also need a flyer to promote the church.

**Treasurer's Report**: Jeff went through the line items as they are at this time. Report accepted as presented.

Motion to go into executive session at 6:54 (J Bergquist, P Sutherland) Motion passed.

Motion to come out of executive session at 7:01. (J. Bergquist, C. Cushman) Motion passed.

Motion to hire Eddie Wilkin as our choir director. (Lanz, Lisananti) Motion passed unanimously.

**Pastor's time**: John. There will be a memorial service for Muriel's sister on June 24. John has posted his office hours, but please call ahead to

make sure John is here during that time. Feel free to come, but he might be out visiting.

#### **Committee Reports**:

**Buildings and Grounds**– Bill. The committee has gotten estimates for work that has to be done. A door in the children's center, some landscaping to move water away from the building, and a window in the lower level bathroom need to be fixed.

Phone has been shut off at the parsonage. There are several areas in the parsonage that need to be cleaned out before the closing. It was suggested that we get a dumpster to clean out the basement in the parish house, so we can use the space for storage of the stuff from the parsonage. There will be a date set for the clean out. Motion to fund the estimates committee has received, including the cost of the dumpster, to be funded by the Rainy Day fund. (J Bergquist, Lisananti) Motion passed.

**Finance**– no meeting

**Music**– Connie – Music committee is looking for special music for the summer. Some suggestions were offered. Give other ideas to Connie.

**Outreach**– Phyllis. Committee has met, and has been giving away some funds. It would be good to hear of the recipients of our donations in church.

**PCCC**– Phyllis - Meeting was devoted to the gardens. There are 3 gardens this year – here, at St. Dominic's and near the baseball field. Our garden will be planted.

**Social**– Kathy – Committee is prepared for Glenn's celebration on Sunday. There will be a sign-up sheet for the picnic. Vespers will have an ice cream social after the service. Please let Kathy know the date new members will be welcomed. There will be a collation to follow the memorial service for Muriel's sister on June 24 at 2:00.

Nominating- no meeting

**Children's Center**– Ellen. Heather Martin will be resigning. JoAnn Stockton will take her place. They will have a business manager with business training, as required. Proctor schools are soliciting for 4-year-olds, so they may all end up at public school. That remains in question. **Bazaar**– Paul is going to begin putting articles about white elephants.

Ad Hoc committee– John – This committee has divided into 3 groups: Media group, worship group and outreach are meeting separately to determine ideas that they think might work.

#### Old business-

Sale of the parsonage– Jeff. Inspection was done and accepted. Closing is July 11. Paul Sutherland is authorized to sign at closing. Motion to authorize Paul Sutherland and Rufus Cushman to sign documents at closing. (E Sutherland, Lisananti) Motion passed.

**Kitchen Renovation**– Jeff. Estimates to renovate the kitchen were passed around. It is quite expensive, so that project will be put on hold. There was a discussion about breaking the project into smaller parts. The Finance committee and Buildings and Grounds should attempt to get an estimate for various parts of the renovation so we can apply to Mortimer Proctor Fund.

**Pastoral Relations Committee**– Barbara had some information available in choosing committee members. Committee should be 3 members. John is thinking about people who might be on that committee.

**Membership celebration**– Barbara. It would happen in October. Discuss at August meeting; announce in September for the event in October.

#### New Business:

Administrative Position– There was a question as to what this person would do. There doesn't seem to be an immediate need, so the discussion was tabled. John would like to meet with people who are interested in doing work with Facebook and the Website.

**Sunday School**– Karen Webster offered to do the Sunday School since she feels we need to have a Sunday School. Curriculum for K-6 was purchased a couple of years ago. She would like to have someone do it with her. John will give her a copy of the curriculum. Council was excited to have a potential Sunday school again!

**Red Cross Blood Drive** – Red Cross has asked us to host a blood drive. We will ask for a different date than the one they suggested.
