**The Road Not Taken** (Robert Frost - 1874-1963)

Two roads diverged in a yellow wood, And sorry I could not travel both And be one traveler, long I stood And looked down one as far as I could To where it bent in the undergrowth;

Then took the other, as just as fair, And having perhaps the better claim, Because it was grassy and wanted wear; Though as for that the passing there Had worn them really about the same,

And both that morning equally lay In leaves no step had trodden black. Oh, I kept the first for another day! Yet knowing how way leads on to way, I doubted if I should ever come back.

I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I— I took the one less traveled by, And that has made all the difference. This is a timeless poem; a poem that is written to encompass all the years of our lives and the decisions we made and did not make. But, unlike Robert Frost, sometimes the one that we kept for another day evaporates or, even, years later, shows itself again. Life is always moving forward, with or without us.

Ezekiel's story (37:1-14) about 'dry bones' reminds us that, working with the Spirit that resides within each of us, we can change 'roads' as we will. Decisions made or unmade are never left in the dust as we move on; our reactions to those 'road' decisions are what colors our lives like a rainbow or a dust bin.

The best thing about the 'dry bones' story is that God and Ezekiel, working together, actually brings life into the bones. And then, God tells Israel, "I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your soil; then you shall know that I, the Lord, have spoken and will act, says the Lord." (37:14) What do you think happens after we have been placed on our soil? We have to react; we have to

choose roads; we have choices to make and roads to travel.

Travel on, good people, travel on!
