

The Union Church of Proctor continues to reach out beyond our walls to serve our brothers and sisters in Christ in our community and throughout the world. This year, in an effort to be more responsive to emergency needs wherever they exist, the Outreach Committee will allocate the Lenten Offering to The Humanitarian Respite Center. The center is located in McAllen, Texas and is overseen by Catholic Charities of the Rio Grande Valley. It is a collaborative effort composed of Catholic Charities (RGV), the Salvation Army, and the city of McAllen. It provides a place of respite and much needed supplies so that immigrants (50-200 per day) may continue on their journey. Thank you in advance for giving what you can during this Lenten Season to support a great humanitarian effort.
