HOWE FAMILY MEMORIALS ESTABLISHED



Union Church has recently received bequests from the estate of long-time member Donna Howe. Donna joined the church as a young teenager in 1965. Her parents, Don and Helen Howe, served the church in several volunteer capacities for many, many years including Don in the maintenance and upkeep of our buildings and grounds, and Helen in the planning and organizing of the annual bazaar. Donna followed in her mother's footsteps and was often seen assisting at the bazaar as well.

The first of Donna's bequests arrived right around the time our sanctuary heating system failed. Her gift was put right to work along with other funds to help underwrite the cost of the replacement system over the winter.

Recently, under the guidance of our Finance Committee and the Church Council, an additional bequest from Donna was used to establish two memorial funds at Union Church. The first, the "Donna Howe Daycare Scholarship Fund," will honor Donna's long career as an elementary school teacher. Since The Children's Center daycare and school is housed in our Parish House, and The Baby Center for infants is under that umbrella (and is located in our former parsonage), providing daycare scholarships to those families seemed an appropriate use of Donna's gifts. Clearly, she cared a great deal about children and their well-being.

The second memorial fund is the "Howe Family Stained Glass Window Preservation Fund." In addition to his years of dedicated stewardship of our buildings, Don Howe was also custodian of the Proctor Elementary School. Obviously, keeping things in good order was a priority and a mission for him! Helen Howe loved beautiful things and ran a successful antiques business in the area, so we thought providing for the preservation of our sanctuary's treasured antique stained-glass windows would be a perfect melding of their interests.

Union Church is very grateful to Helen, Don and Donna for their dedication to our church community and for Donna's bequests to the church. With these two funds, their legacy will live on.
