If you read Matthew 25:31-46 (Sheep and Goats) and Luke 10:25-37 (The Good Samaritan), you find that Jesus is very clear about where we should stand as Christians. In the quote above, Spong gives the view of where God is, and it is the same view that Jesus gives in the gospels.

Within Christianity, we are surrounded by the "Christians" who think otherwise. But, from where I sit, if you cannot agree with Spong's statement and Jesus' words in Matthew and Luke, then you are not a Christian. We need to step up and be counted, not by the world, but by the words of Jesus!


